Historical Society Annual Meeting Thursday, April 17, 7:30pm, Grange Estate

The annual meeting of the Haverford Township Historical Society begins with a brief business meeting and board member elections. After the meeting our guest speaker, Dr. George Boudreau, will take the floor. Refreshments will follow. Members as well as guests are welcome to attend.

"Independence Square: America's Birthplace" Dr. Boudreau's presentation looks at the place we think of as Independence Hall and the square that surrounds it. We will explore the hall's location, appearance and how it's creation reflects the culture and society of 18th century Pennsylvania. The presentation recounts how these spaces were used by the people of Philadelphia to proclaim their independence. Many familiar and unfamiliar biographies flesh out the story, including those of William Penn, Benjamin Franklin, George Washington.

Dr. Boudreau is an Associate Professor of History & Humanities at Penn State University-Harrisburg. He has taught early American history for over 20 years with a particular emphasis on physical spaces and material culture, the transformation of early Philadelphia's culture, and the life and writings of Benjamin Franklin. He has spoken to patriotic, heritage and historical organizations, and has lectured for Philadelphia's Elderhostel Program. He was the Director of the Powel House museum from 1996-1998.



Conservation Assessment Program Report

In 2013, the HTHS received a Conservation Assessment Program (CAP) grant, which enabled us to engage the services of two professional consultants to survey our buildings and historic collections and make recommendations for improvements.

The consultants Michael Henry (Engineer and Architect of Watson & Henry Associates) and Susan Duhl (Art Conservation and Collections Consultant) identified several key strengths. First, they commended the commitment, professional background, and length of service of key board members as well as the dedication of our all-volunteer staff. They also praised our successful public and educational events and our locally relevant archival and library collections. In addition, they recognized the significance of the historic structures we administer (Lawrence Cabin, Nitre Hall, and Federal School) and appreciated their use as educational resources.

Areas of concern were also identified, specifically: we are under-resourced in finances, time, institutional business practices, and the number of active volunteers. The consultants were particularly concerned that the interior condition of Nitre Hall failed to provide an optimal environment for the building, the collections, and the occupants. A significant moisture problem at the Federal School also caused alarm. These problems can be rectified with professional guidance and a financial investment. Further, the consultants strongly recommended re-examining our use of space in Nitre Hall and our approach to storing our historic three-dimensional and archival collections in order to improve access and better preserve the collections.

In order to implement the CAP report's recommendations, the Board will be looking for ways to raise additional revenue, recruit more members, and engage a larger number of volunteers to assist with specific projects. Stay tuned for exciting volunteer opportunities!


