## Heritage Festival Set for June 6, 11 am - 4 pm






New Roof for the Summer Kitchen at Nitre Hall By Mary Courtney

Wessley Sessa and craftsmen from 18th Century Restoration returned to re-roof the structure they built for the historical society in 1991. # **Time Capsule Discovered During Federal School Renovation**

"To our friends of the future" . . . so begins a letter written by Joseph J. Lombardi, dated April 30, 1976 and included in a time capsule hidden under the floor in the Federal School. The time capsule was discovered recently when township carpenters took up a section of the wood floor in need of replacement due to termite damage.

The capsule, wrapped simply in a brown ABC Bakery grocery bag, contained items relevant to the times 34 years ago. These include Dr. Lombardi's Optimist Club blazer, Bicentennial memorabilia, 25c Septa tokens, and local maps. In addition there was a list of the Optimist Club members involved in the extensive 1976 restoration of the Federal School. Time, Sports Illustrated and Philadelphia Magazines of the period

were also included. Of particular interest, in light of the recent Winter Olympics in Vancouver, is the Time cover story, featuring Dorothy Hamill in the 1976 winter Olympics held in Innsbruck.



Dr. Lombardi's letter closes with the following sentiment: "Our greetings to you in whatever period in time this is found and we sincerely hope and pray the world and society is in a better state than it is at this time. God bless you. Joseph J. Lombardi"

Plans are currently being made for the display of the time capsule items in the near future. Special thanks to carpenters Greg Basile, Brett Cardarelli and Dan Perri who completed the Federal School repairs and found the time capsule.
