SAMUEL SEIGLE (1898-19xx)

SAMUEL SEIGLE, superintendent of the Haverford Township Police Force, was born in Philadelphia, March 25, 1898, a son of William and Kate (Bradley) Seigle, both of whom are deceased. Samuel Seigle received his education in the Philadelphia Public Schools, after which he enlisted in the United States Regular Army, 29th Infantry, serving from 1916 to 1920 with the rank of sergeant. Upon his retirement, he joined the Haverford Township Police Force as a patrolman and in the intervening years worked his way up through the ranks to his present position. He has brought an increased efficiency to the organization and is highly regarded by the people of the community. He married Frances Kitey, of Philadelphia and they have two children:

Mr. Seigle is a supporter of the Republican Party and a member of the Masonic Order, Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks, and the American Legion. The Seigle family reside at 1606 Beverly Road, Upper Darby [post office, in Haverford Township].
